Shakespeare Research Frost

In preparation for our study of Shakespeare's *Hamlet*, you will work collaboratively with a small group of no more than 3 students, to research and present on the life and time of William Shakespeare. Your group will choose from one of the following topics:

- Shakespeare's Life & Work
- Elizabethan Literature (excluding Shakespeare's work)
- World History: The World Outside of England (1560's 1620's)
- The Elizabethan Theater
- Art, Music, Food & Culture of the Elizabethan Era
- Shakespeare in the Modern Age
- Scandal, Controversy and other Misdemeanors of the Elizabethan Age

You will have 1.5 days of class time to research and prepare for your presentation. Your presentation must include the following:

- 4-5 minutes in length
 - 1 minute grace period over 6 minutes in length, group will start losing points)
- Include an originally created handout for reference (1 copy per student)
 - You are responsible for making and sourcing your own photocopies.
 - 6th Period 22 Copies; 7th Period 12 Copies
 - If you ask me to make copies or print for you − I will do it, but your group will lose 1 letter grade off the final score.
- Visually appealing poster that highlights the most important takeaways from your research. These will be displayed in the hallway.
- Each group must turn in ONE MLA style works cited page.
- All group members must speak and present a portion of the content.
- If you use a PowerPoint, points will be deducted for reading from the slides. Notecards or note sheets are okay, but do not read from them.
- Tell a story paint a picture of the time period which we are about to enter. Make it interesting. Don't put your audience to sleep.

Your individual grade will primarily come from:

- Time management (both during class prep time & presentation)
- Quality and originality of your reference handout
- Quality and depth of your poster visual
- MLA works cited
- Preparedness, flow & organization of presentation
- Overall quality, effectiveness and presentation of information
